Special Programs for advanced and slow learners

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Catering to Student Diversity

To support advanced and slow learners, following actions are taken:

- 1. Class teacher prepares the list of advanced and slow learners by taking feedback from different teachers based on participation of the students in class room discussions, performance in class tests, online quiz, Moodle courses, assignments, class room seminars, mini projects and feedbacks measure their learning abilities.
- 2. Mentor allotment is done by department at the beginning of academic year. Preferably, mentors shall be appointed at beginning of second year and shall continue till student passes out. For first year, mentors are appointed for one year only. Mentors are responsible to monitor progress of the advanced and slow learners. Also, they are responsible to identify reluctant students and provide basic counselling. Mentors prepare the report and submit to HOD periodically.
- 3. Subject teachers also identify advanced and slow learners as per the academic performance in their subjects (may include parameters like attendance, class performance, ability to solve assignment, lab performance, test performance, etc.). Subject teachers prepare report and submit to class teacher.
- 4. For slow learners, remedial lectures/tutorials are conducted on regular basis. This will help them to perform better in the academics.
- 5. To support advanced learners, they are encouraged to participate in technical teams, project competitions, hackathons and prepare for competitive examinations.






Figure 1: Morkle tree with all the frames as the leaf nodes
