1. Soft skills development Programs



2. Language and Communication Skills

Language Lab of Fr. CRCE addresses the communication and soft skills needs of the learners with a coherent way of learning quality communication designed to add value to the students' personalities and create a fair scope of meaningful professional journey for them. The focus areas include vocabulary building, pronunciation, and other LSRW aspects that are backed by the core activities including role plays, group discussions, extempore, CLARITY Software activities for learning basic English with LSRW activities (headphones assist them in better listening and learning), SWOT analysis for personality development, and Motivational movie sessions for constructive thinking and positive personality grooming. The Communication Skills faculty members also incorporate activities like group discussion and mock interviews. The issues like faint voice or lack of oratory skills are resolved with voice modulation activities. The lab is equipped with 20 PCs which assist the students in using the abovementioned software for grasping integrated skills for preparation for competitive examinations (IELTS, GRE, etc.).\











The activity related to voice modulation was for selected students who came up with the issue regarding their voice being faint in public speaking, thus adding to their fear of public speaking. The students were asked to scan the code and practice those activities. In the next step the students filled a feedback form after a face-to-face interaction with the teacher. The following step marked the furtherance of what they practiced with additional focus on listening and speaking through podcasts, TEDx, etc. The pivotal areas included pace, tempo, pitch, volume and tone.





Diagnostic Test, 11/15/2022

The second day of the FE Induction program started with a **Diagnostic Test** to evaluate the students' basic knowledge in English, Maths and Computer systems. The test was objective type and of one hour duration conducted online through Google platform. This was followed by the presentations of Student council, Technical and non-technical councils, Student project groups and other student chapters of professional organizations to apprise the new entrants of the extracurricular and co-curricular activities.

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Report on Activities (Employability skills, Professional Communication and Ethics)

This event covered following topics

- 1. Public speaking
- 2. Nonverbal demonstration using flipped classroom
- 3. Group discussion
- 4. Panel discussion

The academic year 2022-23, became the cynosure of events, uncovering innovativeness and treading towards professional communication, enveloped in the ethical suit. A diagnostic test was conducted at the beginning of semester I, on 15.11. 2022 which also included a set of questions on basic English. The students were instructed to undertake the test using a link. This helped in identifying the weak students and setting teacher goals for teaching and training them.



The professors of Communication skills conducted various events, ensuring the grooming process of the students. The first initiative was when the students found their opportunities to shed the baggage of stage fright or the fear of public speaking. First Year Engineering students expressed their thoughts on their experiences in round one and the second round comprised extempore- where they picked up a chit and chose their topic to speak on. This continued with public speaking as a test, conducted by Dr. Joseph Rodrigues and Prof. Aastha Bhatia.







The mundane classroom teaching took a backseat when the lecture on Non-verbal communication was conducted. An innovative teaching method was incorporated by using flipped classrooms and Prof. Aastha Bhatia emphasized the importance of Non-Verbal cues in the different setups of formal and informal arenas. The students interpreted the Non-Verbal Cues by looking at the demonstrations. Five students were called to the platform where they had to display the cues as shown to them by the professor.



After tracing the individual public speaking capacities of the First-Year students, the students were encouraged to participate in the Double-Stranded Panel Discussion. The students indulged in reading the *Student's Handbook on Essentials of Ethics*. Post, the skimming and scanning of the document, they were divided into Strand 1 and Strand 2 (Team AG and CT). A team leader was appointed. Each group had one moderator and two writers. The discussion was regulated by the moderator and a written record was maintained by the appointed writers.





Later on, the team came up with a well-curated report, following the norms of report presentation.


Students feedbacks




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


















Blood Donation Camp

Launch Footslog poster on our Instagram page on 17th September 2022 and release the registration form soon after that.PR message to be circulated on Whatsapp Groups.

Various Pre-arrangement Planning:

1. Budge planning and approval from college

- 2. Transport: Get in touch with a bus agency who will be willing to provide 3-4 buses based on the size and seating capacity. Ask if the transportation charges covers all aspects such as tolls, petrol etc.
- 3. Trek Guide: Get in touch with a trek guide and check his availability throughout the day and we
- 4. Breakfast and Lunch: Arrange for a healthy breakfast with help of a caterer amd make sure good quality of food is being delivered. Place the order for the required number of boxes atleast 3 days prior. The breakfast should be delivered to college by 5:30am on 1st October. For Lunch, search a good restaurant on the way back to Bandra which is willing to accommodate 188 people and offer
- 5. Seating: finalize a seating arrangement between buses with 2 junior council members, 2 senior council members and a faculty member in each bus.





Every individual present found it to be an eye-opening and informative session. The talk was concluded with a bouquet and a token of love from our chairperson, Dr. Sapna Prabhu.






It was an individual Competition. Everyone was allotted 1 hour to come with their posters which were to be hand drawn.

Professors from FRCRCE which are Dr. Hemant Khanolkar and Dr. Jagruti Save served as judges for the competition.





its rising crisis for electricity. In the end, she highlighted the concept of Sustainable Energy. A short Q&A session made the webinar more interactive.










5. ICT FACILTIES IN CLASSROOMS, AUDITORIUM AND SEMINAR HALL SMART CLASSROOMS:








Internet Center:
